1. WORLD EVENTS

- 1. World Education Forum, 19 22 May, Incheon, Korea. Under the overall theme "Equitable and inclusive quality education and lifelong learning for all by 2030 Transforming lives through education" the Forum focused on Education 2030, as part of the Sustainable Development Goals. With focus on five themes: Right to Education, Equity in Education, Inclusive Education, Quality Education, and Lifelong learning, the Forum adopted the Incheon Declaration. It was agreed that Quality Education also develops the skills, values and attitudes that enable citizens to lead healthy and fulfilled lives, make informed decisions, and respond to local and global challenges through education for sustainable development (ESD). - 2. **5th International Students' Conference**, 5 8 June, Tongji University, Shanghai, China. The annual International Student Conference on Environment and Sustainability launched by Tongji and UNEP in 2011, gave voice to the international students, provided them with a platform to work together, exchange ideas on critical environmental issues and create new solutions. - 3. International Sustainable Campus Network (ISCN) Conference, Hong Kong University, Hong Kong, China, 17 19 June. The Conference provided a global forum to support leading colleges, universities, and corporate campuses in the exchange of information, ideas, and best practices for achieving sustainable campus operations and integrating sustainability in research and teaching. The conference was co-hosted by the International Sustainable Campus Network (ISCN) and The University of Hong Kong. More info

8th World Environmental Education Congress (WEEC8), 29 June – 2 July, Gothenburg, Sweden

This year's theme was "Planet and People- how can they develop together?", and included 11 thematic areas. The Congress was attended by over 800 participants from different countries globally who either worked or had an interest in Education for Environment and Sustainable Development attended the congress. It was hosted by University of Gothenburg and Chalmers University of Technology through the Centre for Environment and Sustainability together with the WEEC Permanent Secretariat. GUPES Activities

- 1. Opening Ceremony and Opening Plenary: A video message from Mr. Achim Steiner, Executive Director of UNEP, was played during the opening ceremony of WEEC 8. He emphasized empowerment and taking action in achieving sustainable living. Watch UNEP ED's Speech
- GUPES Partnerships Forum (Side Event): EETU organized a side event, which featured 50 participants, and included presentations by UNEP members and representatives from academia and other organizations from Africa, Latin and North America, Asia-Pacific and Europe. The forum also featured interactive discussions, presentation of the GUPES strategic review and update on the Greening Universities Toolkit Vol. 2. The Forum was followed by an interactive panel discussion on "Connecting, Collaborating and Changing" which involved GUPES universities representatives and partners: Alex Leicht (UNESCO), John Holmberg (Chalmers University, Sweden); Akpezi Ogbuigwe (APEZ Center, Nigeria); Heila Lotz-Sisitka (Rhodes University, South Africa); Marceline Collins-Figueroa (University of West Indies, Jamaica); Nay Htun (State University of New York, USA); which was moderated by lain Patton (Environmental Association for Universities and Colleges, UK) and focused on a Global Alliance of Sustainability Education Networks. - 3. International Training Programme on ESD in Higher Education (Workshop): EETU organized a workshop on developing a Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) on ESD through South-North Collaboration through the International Training Program, which was moderated by Mariam Osman, Environmental Education Specialist, EETU. Muchaiteyi Togo (University of South Africa) gave a presentation on ITP change programs in Africa and their contribution towards sustainable development; Heila Lotz-Sisitka (Rhodes University, South Africa) elaborated on ITP change projects in the African context and emphasized on contextualization of this into a Local Open Online Course (LOOC)/ MOOC to give it a voice locally and globally; and David Kronlid (Uppsala University, Sweden) stressed on the relevance of a MOOC on ESD which will interconnect with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and fulfill some of the Global Action Programme (GAP) actions. - 4. Sustainable Campuses: Universities Walking the Talk (Symposia): EETU organized a GUPES symposium which focused on sharing best practices on sustainable campuses, as part of "whole institution approach" under the Global Action Programme on Education for Sustainable Development. A sustainable

campus is one that develops process or management systems that help create a vibrant campus economy & high quality of life while respecting the need to sustain natural resources and protect the environment. Sustainable campuses thus serve as living models of sustainability, providing learning experiences that students, faculty and staff may develop, apply and practice at their campuses and in their extended communities. Mariam Osman (UNEP Environmental Education and Training Unit) moderated the event; Jenny Forshufvud (Chalmers University of Technology, Sweden) gave a presentation on energy conservation model and upcoming hotspot of the sustainable university; Malay Dave (University of New south Wales, Australia) presented the Greening Universities Toolkit Vol. 2 (Advance Copy) and requested for submission of new case studies for inclusion in the final copy of the toolkit; Eddi Omrcen (University of Gothenburg, Sweden) presented the Environmental Management System (EMS) implementation at Gothenburg University; and Gayatri Ragwa (Environment Agency, UAE) presented the Sustainable Campus Initiative; a project for the students that will foster responsibility of the ecological footprint in the UAE campuses. - 5. GUPES Steering Committee Meeting: The third meeting of the GUPES Steering Committee was held in the evening of 28 June 2015. Representatives from 5 GUPES regions were present. An update on GUPES progress over the past year was presented, with focus on 3 pillars: education, training and networking. The meeting deliberated on the GUPES Strategic Review, and agreed on consolidation of GUPES in terms of management, networking and activities. - 6. WEEC8 Closing Plenary: Mahesh Pradhan, Chief of the Environmental Education and Training Unit (EETU), participated in the closing plenary session held on 2 July 2015. The main topic of the plenary session was "The end of the Decade for Sustainable Development." The six panelists evaluated the progress of WEEC 2015 and their thoughts on the achievements after the end of the decade and the outlook post decade.
